Step 1: Daily Objective

Step 2: Instruction (What will the teachers do?)

Mon 13: Teacher will explain the project and thoroughly outline the rubric to ensure student understanding. After explanation, students are to sit in their assigned groups. A leader from each group with choose a card with a country on it. Once all groups have their countries, they may commence their brainstorming and research.

Tues 14: Teacher will continue to monitor groups are working toward a common goal and help guide where necessary. Students should be researching and starting a presentation plan of some sort.

Wed 15: Teacher will continue to monitor student progress. Students should be wrapping up research and continuing to work on their presentation.

Thurs 16: Teacher will be pushing students to wrap up their presentations and practice where necessary. Presentation are due Friday, and will be presented on Monday.

Fri 17: Even though there are no formal classes today, students should ensure all presentations are shared with the teacher or submitted into showbie as a PDF.

Mon 20: Teacher will grade presentations for the "W.S.S.A.Y.C" project as students present their mini-lessons about their assigned country in Europe. Students will grade their group members in an anonymous review for a participation grade. An average score for all students will result in the participation grade.
